

Our History

FXB Rwanda is affiliated to FXB International created in 1989 by Albina du Boisrouvray, Mother of François-Xavier Bagnoud. Albina found FXB International and FXB foundation in honor of her son, François-Xavier, who was killed in tragic helicopter accident at his 24 age back in 1986.

With its reach to Rwanda in 1995, the organization started implementing the programs which were to back economically the families whose vulnerabilities were mainly deteriorated by 1994 Genocide. FXB Rwanda joined hands with other stakeholders and government of Rwanda in the process of helping the community and the country to recover from these effects.



Since 2000, FXBVillage model, a unique holistic model of FXB to eradicate the poverty, was introduced in Rwanda through FXB Rwanda covering the domains of economic strengthening, nutrition and WASH, education, social and health. This model was stewarded and implemented in different country's locations since that time until to date.



In 2012, FXB Rwanda registered as local non-governmental organization and continued to work against its vision of creating a world fit for children. The organization is from then striving to reach its envisioned goal through economic strengthening, education support, HIV/AIDS interventions (prevention, care and treatments), violence prevention, early childhood development, and health interventions. Throughout this journey, numerous projects were implemented across different districts of Rwanda.

Message from Executive Director



François Xavier Bagnoud (FXB) Rwanda is happy to share its annual narrative report which details key accomplishments of the fiscal year 2021-2022. The accomplishments and achievements presented are the results of effort made by the FXB Rwanda stakeholders and partners which we are so thankful to.

As the world was still grappling with Covid-19 and its effects, 2021-2022 presented a new hope for François Xavier Bagnoud (FXB) Rwanda with maintained effort of the stakeholders to make this happens. FXB Rwanda continued to align to its 2019-2024 strategic plan heading to achieve the objectives stated therein.

This fiscal year was characterized of numerous new projects with the continuous eager to evolve interventions to more people in need. Two FXB Village model programs were implemented including one new to level up poor people reaching 1,380 households with holistic approaches of poverty eradication.

The support of organization in HIV/AIDS prevention was extended to include the service to key population through the newly started project of NSP-HIV/TB implemented in collaboration with Rwanda Biomedical Center.

Our effort was also maintained in implementing the WASH and Nutrition project launched at the end of previous fiscal year to serve children, pregnant and lactating mothers of 150 families with nutrition and WASH interventions; and AMIE project which served 700 Adolescent Girls and Young Women with HIV prevention and vulnerability reduction.

The organization's implementation of USAID Turengere Abana "Let Us Protect the Children" Program since 2012 which was by this fiscal year, was honored with extension to 2027. The effort was maintained in the implementation of our Sugira Muryango (Family Strengthening Interventions) Program with the aim of reveling up the early childhood development among the targeted population.

As we move forward, the situation is turning better on the side of covid-19 and FXB Rwanda backs the effort made by government and other stakeholders by supporting the beneficiary in post-pandemic living conditions. The insistence is made in vulnerability reduction through tangible and mental support provision.

The organization is to extend its support in HIV/AIDS to include the support to key population and looks forward to diversification of effort orientation.

We are thankful to the donors, partners, stakeholders, government institutions, and beneficiaries who helped tremendously FXB Rwanda in this fiscal year and look forward to continuous milestones celebration. achievements.

ECONOMIC STRENGTHENING


ART Adherence

The support was provided to the 406 HIV positive beneficiaries served in this fiscal year to assure they adhere to the ART treatment. The support provided included:

- Follow up on the rendez-vous the beneficiaries had with HC to assure they are respected
- Facilitate them at HC to get served in due time
- Psychosocial support whenever needed
- Nutritional education

- **8903** households (**19,548** caregivers and **9,483** children) reached with ECD interventions
 - Intervention made of 12 ECD, WASH and family strengthening modules delivered through home visiting approach
 - The intervention aims at positive parenting, improved ECD and father engagement in parenting



2,608 village based Inshuti z'Umuryango (IZU) were capacitated to deliver Sugira Muryango Intervention



• **6,285** local officials were trained on ECD and **15,351** Engaged in Intervention

CULINARY DEMONSTRATIONS



At least **1,940** beneficiaries were engaged in organized culinary demonstrations on quarterly basis to update them on best practices while cooking

NUTRITION SUPPORT



The total of **1,034 families** received the continuous nutrition support from the organization. The support provided in cash form following the education on balanced diet and nutrition that the support provided used well as sought.



03

FARMER FIELD SCHOOLS



To have a good nutrition, the caregivers are taught the agriculture techniques for assuring the food availability and security.

During this fiscal year, **16 Farmer Field Schools were run reaching 1,312 families** with modern agricultural techniques to ultimately assure nutrition security.

HYGIENE KITS DISTRIBUTION



4 tanks were distributed to **2 beneficiary schools**, **610** Hygiene Kits and **261** hand washing stations were distributed to beneficial families

WASH EDUCATION



The total of **1,780** direct families and **7,573** indirect beneficiaries receives WASH education package

HOUSES & WASHROOMS REHABILITATION AND CONSTRUCTION



315 toilets and washrooms and **108** houses were built or rehabilitated during reporting time

2800 SERVED

This intervention aims at turning young boys into men free of violence. 2800 boys of 10 to 14 years old benefited this intervention




COMMUNITY CAMPAIGNS


